### PLAYING TAPS

Of all the military bugle calls, none is so recognized or apt to render emotion than Taps. Composed in July of 1862, by Union General Daniel Adams Butterfield. It is a setting of short and long notes that creates deep reflection and remembrance of those who have died. The playing of Taps was officially recognized by the U.S. Army in 1874.

All: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever.

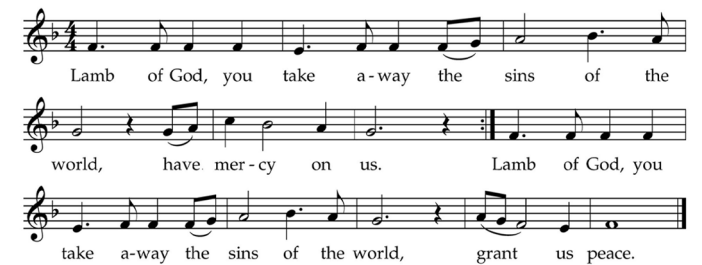
Celebrant: Lord, Jesus Christ... Who lives and reigns forever and ever.
